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# Mayor Garcetti hosts Clean Transportation Forum with Paris Mayor Hidalgo, announces new online platform to help cities electrify their fleets



The Mayor also helped unveil a new 2028 Zero Emissions Roadmap to accelerate the reduction of air pollution over the next decade.

Mayor Eric Garcetti brought climate and industry leaders together for a forum on clean transportation, which he hosted alongside Paris Mayor Anne Hidalgo ahead of this week's Global Climate Action Summit in San Francisco.

Mayors Garcetti and Hidalgo, with a group of thought leaders and policymakers from across the country, discussed innovative ways for cities around the world to make their transportation systems more sustainable — a critical goal for Paris and Los Angeles as they prepare to host the Olympic and Paralympic Games in 2024 and 2028, respectively.

Mayor Garcetti discussed the L.A. Cleantech Incubator's 2028 Zero Emissions Roadmap, a new blueprint to help cities accelerate progress on their emissions reduction goals.

And he announced the launch of the Climate Mayors Electric Vehicle (EV) Purchasing Collaborative — a new online portal that will help lower the cost of electric vehicles by enabling cities to bid on them together in larger quantities. The portal will provide cities across the country equal access to competitive pricing and charging infrastructure.

"The clean transportation revolution is not a distant vision for the far-off future — it's a reality staring us in the face, and it's happening here in Los Angeles and cities across the world," said

Mayor Garcetti. "Through this innovative platform, Climate Mayors are sending a powerful message to the global car market: if you build electric vehicles, we will buy them."

The portal is an unprecedented effort to help cities across the country rapidly electrify their municipal fleets. As a result of the new platform, 20 founding Climate Mayors' cities and two counties have committed to purchasing 391 EVs — a figure that is expected to grow as the program continues to engage cities across the country.

Transportation is the largest and fastest-growing source of U.S. greenhouse gas emissions. By leveraging the buying power of Climate Mayors' cities, the portal will work to accelerate the electrification of local fleets — and help America maintain its commitment to the Paris Climate Agreement.

The platform was developed in partnership with the Electrification Coalition (EC), which will offer expert guidance and information to cities as needed — enabling a more efficient conversion of city fleets and faster expansion of charging infrastructure.

"Today's announcement demonstrates impressive and innovative leadership from cities to electrify their fleets. By transitioning to electric vehicle fleets, we are reducing our oil depen-

dency, driving the EV market and taking a critical step towards meeting the goals of America's Pledge on climate change" said Ben Prochazka, Vice President of the Electrification Coalition. "We are excited to partner with more than 400 cities to provide the tools and resources needed to make it easier for every city in the U.S. to plug-in their fleets into an electric transportation future."

The portal was unveiled today at Mayor Garcetti's Forum on Clean Transportation, a roundtable discussion with key industry and sustainability leaders on collective actions to increase local and international clean transportation initiatives. Mayor Garcetti was joined by Anne Hidalgo, Mayor of Paris and Chair of C40 Cities — a network of 96 megacities committed to urgent action on climate change.

"It is inspiring to see so many American Climate Mayors committing to transform their fleets into electric vehicles," said Anne Hidalgo, Mayor of Paris and Chair of C40 Cities. "They are part of an unstoppable global momentum for change. Thanks to the bold leadership shown by C40's member cities, millions of polluting cars, vans, and buses will soon be replaced by clean alternatives. Cities are concretely getting the job

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## 10 Safety Tips for General Contractors

Among general contractors, one of the biggest concerns on each job site is providing a safe working environment that not only protects employees, subcontractors, vendors, and suppliers, but that also allows for efficient, safe progress toward the end goal. However, with more than

6 million individuals working in the construction industry, it is no surprise that accidents are common. Throughout the United States, there are roughly 150,000 construction accidents each year. To help avoid being part of the growing accident statistics, licensed general contractors must take precautions on the job to ensure through the following safety tips.

#### 1. Protective Gear

One of the easiest ways to ensure safety on a construction job site is to require protective gear be worn by all workers and visitors. Protective gear comes in many different forms, including eyewear, steel-toed shoes, gloves, and hardhats, all which make a difference in the safety of a site among workers. In addition to mandating the use of protective gear, general contractors must also encourage workers to inspect the condition of the items before use. This helps to safeguard individuals from unnecessary accidents.

#### 2. Equipment Loading and Unloading

On each job site, general contractors must also encourage employees and subcontractors to

pay close attention to the loading and unloading of equipment. When working with heavy or awkward materials and supplies, the chance for a machine to roll is high. Workers need to be careful when loading and unloading this type of common construction site material, having more than one person involved in the process, and following guidelines throughout.

#### 3. Getting In and Out of Equipment

In addition to loading and unloading equipment, general contractors should share the importance of taking it slow when getting in and out of equipment or machinery used on the job. Some common safety tips in this arena include checking for slippery surfaces and unstable footing, using a ladder when necessary, and asking for help when warranted. Avoiding fast movement when getting on and off a piece of equipment is also beneficial in keeping safety standards high.

#### 4. Promoting Ladder Safety

Getting up and down ladders on a construction site is a common pitfall for safety issues. General contractors can encourage the safe use of ladders by promoting ladder safety training to start. Construction site workers should also be reminded that there is an appropriate ladder to use for each job, not a one-size-fits-all solution. Ladders should also be inspected to determine their working condition, and workers should always maintain three points of contact when climbing up or down.

#### 5. Hiring Experienced Workers

Subcontractors are a vital part of almost all construction worksites, but not all are created equal. It is up to the general contractor to know the experience other contractors bring to the table, as well as their individual licensing and bonding qualifications. Take a close look at work experience for any new contractor hired for a job, and be sure to vet their references when provided. This offers some peace of mind that safety guidelines will be met throughout the job.

#### 6. Being Aware of Potential Hazards

Not all general contractors spend each day on a job site, but it is crucial to, at a minimum, take

### **Handling Reading**

What should you do with all of those things you saved with the good intention to read them soon? You know, that stack or that box of magazines, professional journals, newsletters and generally interesting stuff? It is amazing how rapidly it can grow out of your reading drawer, cascade down the side of the desk, and finally end up residing in stacks and boxes. There is so much information available now, even before we consider all of the electronic resources, that it is easy to become overwhelmed. Here are some suggestions on how to keep the stacks down while staying current on key events in your field.

#### Recognize Your Limitations

Depending on how severe your situation, it is quite possible that you will not be able to catch up on your entire backlog. If it has been sitting for six months or longer, throw it out. Once it is this old, even if you do find time to read it, it will no longer be current. Reading piles do not age gracefully. They serve no purpose unread, collecting dust or making you feel guilty. In spite of the fear of not being caught up with the latest information, the truth is you have survived quite well to this point without it. Rather than try to catch up focus instead on strategies for staying current. From today onward what will you do differently?

#### Evaluate

Evaluate the publications you receive by asking, "What would happen if I did not get it?" "How often does it offer something genuinely useful, not just interesting?" "Which periodicals offer the most information in the best format?" Information is only useful if it informs you; therefore,

it is better to read in-depth, understand, and use three or four publications than to subscribe to more, just to have them sit unread. Take the few minutes to remove yourself from distribution lists and cancel subscriptions to publications you rarely read.

#### **Staying Current**

Here are four actions you can take when processing the reading stack:

- Scan first and make a decision. Every fact cannot be as salient as the next. When you keep an item, ask how likely you are to use it again in the near future. This helps to screen out the nonessential. Many to-read items actually need to be thrown away (or recycled.)
- Read it and file with related information. If the material to read is short, then read it the first time you touch it, and put it away immediately
- 3. File the information with related material unread. In-depth reading generally takes too long when it first crosses your desk. As you sort through your in-basket, skim the periodical, clip the article of interest and file immediately. If your last staff meeting was discussing flexible work time, when you notice an article in the Harvard Business Review on engineering firms that implemented flextime, cut it out and place it in the file. After you have gathered all the information and are ready to compare options, then read it fully.
- Route it to someone else. Routed items, reports and catalogs often get sent to the wrong person. When this happens, identify the correct person and send it along.

 Read the conclusion or recommendations section first. Go back to the text for details only if necessary.

## O Small Business Grants & Loans for Veterans

The 21.8 million veterans in the United States have made remarkable sacrifices in their service and deserve all the appreciation they receive and more. Their time in the military and the skills they've developed give them a distinct perspective, which they can use to start amazing businesses. Like any person trying to start their own business, veterans need capital to get things off the ground. Multiple institutions offer grants or financing options with specific benefits for veterans.

Generally, to qualify for veteran grants or financing, you must fall into one of the following categories:

- Honorably Discharged Veterans (some grants may specify a particular conflict or time period, e.g. post-9/11 era)
- Service-Disabled Veterans
- Active Duty Military service member participating in the military's Transition Assistance Program (TAP)

Current spouse of any Veteran, Active Duty service member, or any Reservist or National Guard member; or widowed spouse of a service member who died while in service or of a service-connected disability.

If you fall into one or more of the above categories, here are some possible options for you to finance or move your business along.

#### 1. SBA Veterans Advantage 7(a) Loan

The 7(a) loan is the Small Business Association's primary and most popular program. With longer terms and potentially lower down payments than other financing options, it's a great option when you're looking for capital for your small business. Typically, the SBA, or many other lenders, require an upfront guarantee fee. For SBA 7(a) loans made to qualifying Veteran-owned businesses under \$125,000, the upfront guarantee fee will be \$0.

As the loan amount goes up, the SBA may still require a fee, but at a discounted rate compared to those for non-veteran owned businesses.

#### Reservists and National Guard Members; 2. Military Reservist Economic Injury Disaster Loan Program (MREIDL)

In the situation that an essential employee has been called to active duty, the business may qualify for MREIDL. Funds from this loan program can be used to "provide the amount of working capital needed by a small business to pay its necessary obligations as they mature until operations return to normal after the essential employee is released from active military duty.'

The loan amount can be up to \$2 million based on the SBA's assessment, and any loan over \$50,000 requires collateral, in the form of real estate when possible.

#### 3. StreetShares Foundation

StreetShares Foundation was established with veteran small-business owners in mind. Apart from offering lines of credit, term loans, and government-contract financing to cover the cost of payroll and equipment before invoices are paid. This year, they awarded \$15,000 after an application period to a veteran-owned small business. Keep an eye on them for future

reward opportunities and check out their current financing options.

#### 4. Hivers and Strivers Angel Fund

Hivers and Strivers is an angel fund looking to assist military academy graduates with their startups. Their investments range from \$250,000 to \$1 million per round, and they may syndicate with other groups for larger investments. If you're a graduate of one of the military academies and have a small business idea, you can make your submission on their website.

#### 5. VA Office of Small & Disadvantaged **Business Utilization (OSDBU)**

The Department of Veterans Affairs offers potential assistance to businesses owned by economically disadvantaged individuals through their Office of Small and Disadvantaged Business Program. Their goal as a department is to provide these businesses with as many government contracts as possible. While this is not a financial grant or loan, the allocation of these contracts could mean money in the bank if your business qualifies.

inventory of each new project's lay of the land. Potential hazards may be lurking that can result in devastating accidents. Being aware of hazardous conditions on the job is crucial to eliminating unnecessary safety risks.

#### 7. Maintenance of Equipment and Tools

Maintaining the condition of equipment and tools used in construction work is also essential to increase efficiencies in safety. Malfunctioning equipment can quickly put workers in harm's way, leading to accidents and injuries that are completely avoidable. General contractors should spend time each visit inspecting the state of equipment and tools to ensure they are in good working order.

#### 8. Decreasing Crowded Work Areas

Construction sites can get crowded quickly, especially when a big project is underway. Instruct workers, vendors, and suppliers to remove themselves from locations that do not require their attention. Reducing the number of people lessens the risk of accidents, and general contractors can accomplish this safety task by putting strict guidelines in place at the start of each project.

#### 9. Worker Education

Even when subcontractors are evaluated for hire based on their previous industry experience and licensing qualifications, ongoing worker training is a must. To ensure safety

standards are up to date with best practices in the industry, general contractors should encourage their staff to partake in training courses either in-person or online. Safety training courses are available through OSHA as well as several other outlets. Being educated about safety standards helps reduce accidents and injuries among construction workers.

#### 10. Communication

The most important safety tip for general contractors boils down to clear, concise communication. This, however, is often easier said than done. Start with establishing the chain of command on each job site, and use the communication mediums that make the most sense for the crew. Also, it is important to be available via those channels when workers need guidance or assistance on the job. It is also important to master the skill of listening, as workers may share important safety concerns or suggestions throughout a project.

Taking these small steps to ensure safety on a construction site as a general contractor can make a significant difference in reducing accidents and injuries over the course of a project.

- 2. Highlight passages as you read. This makes review time much easier.
- Where appropriate, have your administrative assistant, associate or colleague highlight information prior to your initial review.
- Never save a stack of items with articles to be clipped later. Clip the article, note the source, and recycle the rest of the periodical.
- For long documents, use spot reading. Read the recommendations or conclusion section first. Look for the purpose of the document by reading the subject line. Note headings, captions, notations under charts, graphs and first sentences of each paragraph.
- Read while commuting, waiting for appointments, or on airplane trips.
- 7. Set aside 30 minutes twice a week to read. Schedule it on your calendar if you need a reminder. Remember that getting the critical reading done is better than doing none at all

Be sure to register with their office. Once your business has been verified, it will be added to their directory of small businesses and could be called upon for a government contract

#### 6. Nav's Small Business Grant

Nav understands the challenges of starting, financing, and running a small business. To give small business owners a lift, Nav recently launched the \$10,000 "Legitify Your Small Business" grant. While you don't have to be a veteran to apply, we'd love to hear about your small business. Keep an eye out for the next application round to open, and check your business and personal credit score for free with Nav.

#### 7. VA Small Business Grants

Meant for non-profit businesses, Department of Veterans Affairs Small Business Grants are aimed at helping veterans get their operations up and running. Like any other grant, this does not have to be repaid, but will require strict compliance on the part of your business. Be sure to review the guidelines before applying to be sure your business is in compliance.

#### 8. VA VR&E Business Ownership Track

If you suffer from a service-connected disability and have the desire and plan to run your own business, you could qualify for assistance from the Vocational Rehab & Employment Ownership Track. Along with the requirements listed above, you must have an employment barrier or handicap, be enrolled in the VR&E, and your disability must make it difficult for you to obtain suitable employment.

Be sure to check the requirements and application to see if you could get help getting your business off the ground.

## 9. Service-Disabled, Veteran-Owned Small Business Program

Similar to the VA's OSDBU program, the Service-Disabled Veteran-Owned Small Business Program aims to provide certain businesses with contracting dollars. The federal government sets aside at least 3 percent of contracting dollars for set-aside contracts for small businesses owned by disabled veterans.

Just like the OSDBU, you should apply for verification through the program before being added to a directory to be considered for certain contracts.

#### 10. LendingClub Veteran Loan

LendingClub is one of many private lenders offering special benefits for veterans. Their small business loan for veterans has a term of one-to-five years, with borrowing limits of \$5,000 to \$300,000. You must have a credit score of at least 600 and a business that has been in operation for at least two years with annual revenue of at least \$50,000.
